## Do you plan to have children or are you waiting a baby?

Do not underestimate prenatal check-ups at the gynecologist. Each pregnant woman should complete three examinations during pregnancy (one in three month). That would definitely reduce possible complications related with delivery.

### Do you have a long-term stay visa in Czech Republic?

### Do you have a commercial health insurance?

- You should procure for yourself a **STANDARD health insurance** that reimburses the costs of health care for a pregnant woman during the period of gestation and the delivery itself. **!!!PAY ATTENTION!!! Reimburses only health care of a future mother**
- **Procure a commercial health insurance for future baby during the period of pregnancy**
- Preventive check-ups at the gynecologist not related with a pregnancy are paid by a woman herself. Important and advisable interval for these examinations is once a year.



### Does your employer pays for you a public health insurance in Czech Republic?

- Procure a commercial health insurance for a future baby during the period of pregnancy, then after being released from the maternity procure a new health insurance for a new-born baby.
- **Keep in mind that the above mentioned public health insurance refers only to a mother and is not applicable to a new-born child** (if you did not apply for a permanent-stay visa for the child in accordance with the Law No.326/1999 Coll.)
- **!!! PAY ATTENTION!!! In case that a labor contract of a future mother is over during the period of pregnancy, the public health insurance is over at the same time.** And she has to procure a commercial health insurance for herself and the future baby.
- All preventive check-ups at the gynecologist will be reimbursed by the valid public health insurance of Czech Republic.



## Do you have a permanent residence in Czech Republic?

- You are a subject of the public health insurance of Cz.R.
- Under the condition that you have a permanent **residence in Cz.R. a new-born child is a subject of the public health insurance of Cz.R. from the date of his birth.**
- Preventive check-ups at the gynecologist will be reimbursed by the public health insurance of Czech Republic.
- When all term and conditions of the Law for foreign residents No. 326/1999 Coll., subsequently amended, are carried out, there is a probability that a child will also be granted a permanent-stay visa and retroactively becomes a subject of public health insurance of Cz.R. and all health care will be reimbursed by Health Insurance Company.



## Was a child born to you?

### Do you have a long-term stay visa in Czech Republic?

After being released from the maternity you must:

1. Procure for the child a **commercial health insurance** – within 8 days after his birth (if you suppose and are sure that the child will not retroactively become a subject of the public health insurance of Cz.R)
2. In the Register office receive a birth record, let it translate by the certified translator into the language of your origin and then let it certify by the municipal authorities
3. Contact the representative body of your country in Cz.R (embassy of your country or state department) and solicit them to inscribe your child in the travel document of a parent or issue the **separate travel document for a child**
4. At the latest within 60 days from the date of birth of the child apply for an appropriate visa – a stay longer than 90 days requires travel document of the child, birth record and a certificate of health insurance valid during all stay in the country

### Do you have a permanent residence in Czech Republic?

After being released from the maternity you must as soon as possible:

1. Apply for a public health insurance in the name of the child within 8 days from his birth (there is a presupposition and certainty that the child retroactively becomes a subject of the public health insurance of Cz.R).
2. In the Register office receive a **birth record**, let it translate by the certified translator into the language of your origin and then let it certify by the municipal authorities.

3. Contact the representative body (embassy of your country or state department) and solicit them to inscribe your child in your travel document or issue the **separate travel document for a child**.
4. Not later than within 60 days after the birth of a child apply the office of asylum and migration policy for a permanent–stay visa for a child.
